In about a week, you will receive a Wisconsin ID or a paper receipt in the mail.

Either one can be used as ID to vote.

The Wisconsin ID looks like a driver license. The paper receipt looks like this:

This receipt is an acceptable Photo ID for voting and serves as your ID Card until your card is issued (s.5.02(6m) Wis. Stats.). This receipt is valid for 60 days and will be automatically renewed unless otherwise cancelled by WisDOT. Additional receipts will be provided as you exercise reasonable efforts to contact DMV staff to discuss your petition application or provide new information to assist in validating your birth record information. If you have further questions regarding your ID Card for voting purposes, please contact DMV using the information above.

Someone from DMV may contact you with questions about your application for an ID for voting. It is important that you answer those questions as best you can because as long as you stay in touch with DMV, we will automatically send you a new paper receipt every 60 days until DMV confirms your information. To keep getting your receipts, you must also let us know if you change your address.

Even if you stop receiving receipts before you get a regular ID card, you can contact DMV at any time and you will get a new receipt. This is true even if your application was suspended or denied.

If DMV denies or cancels your application, you have the right to go to court and ask for judicial review under Chapter 227 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
