
You will soon receive an ID for voting!

In about a week, you will receive a Wisconsin ID or a paper receipt in the mail.

Either one can be used as ID to vote.

The Wisconsin ID looks like a driver license. The paper receipt looks like this:



Someone from DMV may contact you with questions about your application for an ID for voting. It is important that you answer those questions as best you can because as long as you stay in touch with DMV, we will automatically send you a new paper receipt every 60 days until DMV confirms your information. To keep getting your receipts, you must also let us know if you change your address.

Even if you stop receiving receipts before you get a regular ID card, you can contact DMV at any time and you will get a new reciept. This is true even if your application was suspended or denied.

If DMV denies or cancels your application, you have the right to go to court and ask for judicial review under Chapter 227 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
