Purpose of handout


The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is in the process of developing plans for proposed improvements on 26 miles (13 miles in each direction) WIS 54 in Portage and Wood County. The purpose of this handout is to provide information regarding the proposed improvements, describe the potential impacts it would have on the community, and offer an opportunity for public comment.

Public input/comments

Project location

WIS 54 from 26th Street North in village of Biron to County B / WIS 54 roundabout in village of Plover in Portage and Wood County.



Project purpose and need

The purpose of the project is to extend the service life and improve the failing concrete pavement joints. A crack survey completed by WisDOT in 2020 identified 500+ deteriorated joint locations within the project limits of WIS 54. Without repairs the existing concrete joints will fail and cause additional pavement structure failures which will result in greater rehabilitations efforts. In order for this corridor to continue serving as a safe and effective roadway rehabilitation efforts are necessary.

Anticipated benefits

- Extends life of pavement
- Eliminate need for future maintenance costs saving taxpayer dollars in the future
- ADA compliant pedestrian curb ramps

Proposed improvements

This is a perpetuation-level project. Proposed improvements include:

- Concrete pavement joint repairs
- Mill and resurface existing asphalt shoulders, turn lanes, and medians
- Upgrade existing at-grade railroad crossings on WIS 54
- Remove and replace existing concrete curb ramps
- Spot location curb and gutter replacement
- Repair existing storm sewer inlets in village of Biron and village of Plover

Traffic impacts

Construction is scheduled to begin in spring 2025.

During construction, WIS 54 will be reduced to one lane of traffic in each direction with a lane closure. This project also includes the replacement of the WIS 54 at-grade railroad crossing in the village of Plover and village of Biron. During these operations WIS 54 will be under detour to all through traffic for approximately two weeks. Motorist can expect to encounter traffic drums, lane closures and flagging operations. (See detour displays on website)

Temporary intersection and driveway closures will be necessary during parts of the construction process. WisDOT will contact homeowners and businesses in advance before closing a driveway.

Real estate

Additional right of way will be required for this project. The acquisitions anticipated are at existing curb ramp locations at WIS 54 / 42nd Street intersection, and at-grade railroad crossings on WIS 54. Preliminary right of way impacts are shown on the exhibits. WisDOT expects to begin real estate acquisition in summer 2022. (See real estate displays on website)


